### Making History Today

Exciting things are happening at the museum, and sharing them with you reminds me of something filmmaker Ken Burns said, “I subscribe to William Faulkner’s view that history is not just about what we were before but who we are now.”

Here is a picture of who we are now at the museum: We’re a hub for historical experiences, an advocate and leader in the museum community, and a partner for economic development. We’re poised for change, and one thing we know from history is the opportunity that change presents. Director Fred Goss resigned in July after seven years of service, and by the end of the year, a new director and assistant director will join us to begin the next chapter of this organization’s work.

The quality of our work shows, from *Voices of a City’s* recent recognition by the American Association for State and Local History to the overwhelming success of *Down Home: Jewish Life in North Carolina*, which drew some 15,000 visitors in its five-month run. We also welcomed more than 4,000 people for Fun Fourth, and enjoyed national recognition in the July issue of US Airways’ in-flight magazine.

Certainly, we’re an essential local resource. On that note, our Annual Dinner will feature a thoughtful look at the increasing role of history museums in teaching history in communities (*see story, facing page*). A special feature will be the first *Voices of a City* award, which will recognize scholarship and innovation in presenting history to the wider Greensboro community. I know you won’t want to miss being there to find out who wins!
