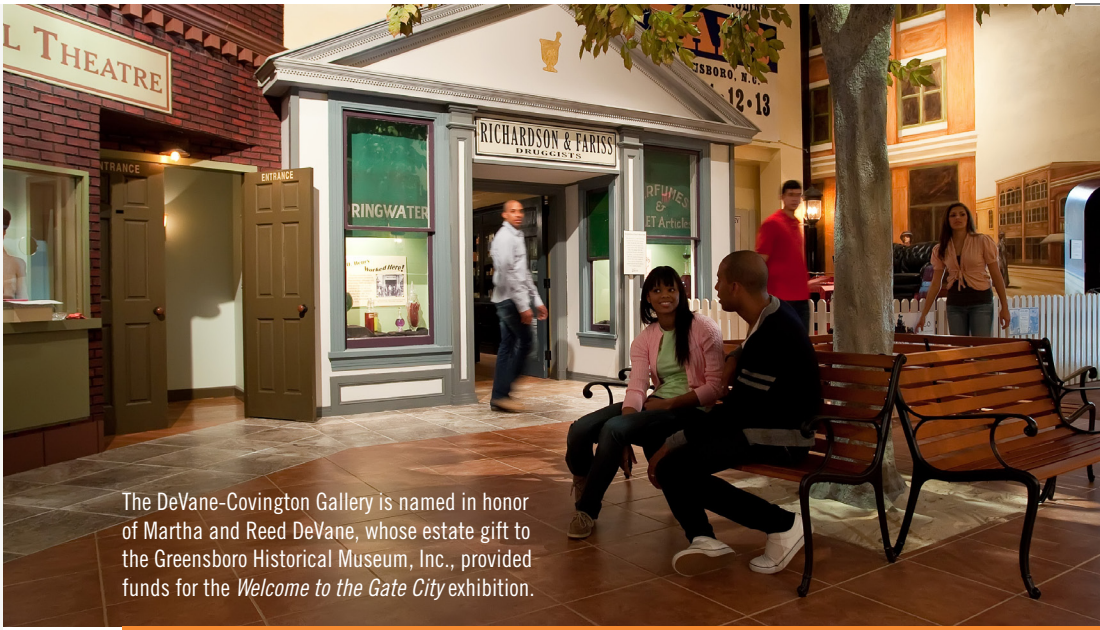
## **THE LION HEART SOCIETY AND PLANNED GIVING**
